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
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## **Travel Vietnam**

#### Day 1: Arrival in Hanoi and City Exploration

Continue to the Temple of Literature, Vietnam's first university, and then explore the Vietnam Museum of Ethnology to understand the country's diverse ethnic cultures. In the evening, enjoy a traditional water puppet show – a unique Vietnamese art form – and have dinner in the vibrant Old Quarter. Overnight stay in Hanoi.

#### Day 2: Hanoi to Halong Bay

After breakfast, depart from Hanoi to the stunning Halong Bay, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Upon arrival, board a traditional junk boat and begin your scenic cruise through the limestone islands and emerald waters. Visit the famous Surprise Cave (Sung Sot Cave) and enjoy optional activities like kayaking or swimming. As the sun sets, savor a fresh seafood dinner on board and spend the night cruising under the stars.

#### Day 3: Halong Bay to Hoi An

Wake up early and join a Tai Chi session on the deck to start your day peacefully. After breakfast, explore a nearby fishing village to see the local way of life. Return to the harbor and transfer back to Hanoi. From there, take a flight to Da Nang and proceed to Hoi An. Check into your hotel and spend the evening wandering through Hoi An's enchanting lantern-lit streets, soaking in its old-world charm.

#### Day 4: Exploring Hoi An

Start your day with a guided walking tour through Hoi An's ancient town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit historical landmarks such as the Japanese Covered Bridge, the old Tan Ky House, and the Fujian Assembly Hall. Later, enjoy a relaxing boat ride along the Thu Bon River and have lunch at a picturesque riverside restaurant. In the afternoon, immerse yourself in a hands-on Vietnamese cooking class. As night falls, stroll through the bustling night market and taste delicious local street food. Overnight stay in Hoi An.

#### Day 5: Hoi An to Ho Chi Minh City

After breakfast, fly from Da Nang to Ho Chi Minh City (formerly Saigon). Start your city tour by visiting the War Remnants Museum, which provides deep insights into the Vietnam War, and the Reunification Palace, a historic symbol of the end of the war. Continue to the iconic Notre-Dame Cathedral Basilica of Saigon and the nearby Central Post Office, both fine examples of colonial architecture. In the evening, enjoy shopping and dining at Ben Thanh Market before heading to the airport or your hotel, marking the end of a memorable journey.

#### Vietnam Travel Guide (for Indians) - At a Glance

#### 1. Flights:

 Direct flights from Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata to Hanoi, Da Nang, Ho Chi Minh City.

#### 2. Visa:

Apply for e-Visa online (<u>official site</u>); \$25, valid for 30 days.

#### 3. Currency:

- Vietnamese Dong (VND); ₹1 ≈ 300–320 VND.
- Carry USD or INR to exchange; cards accepted in cities.

#### 4. Entry Requirements:

- Passport valid for 6 months.
- No COVID test needed currently.

#### 5. **Food**:

- Indian restaurants in major cities.
- Veg food available (look for "chay"); street food is popular and safe.

#### 6. Transport:

- Grab app, taxis, bike taxis.
- Domestic flights, trains, buses for intercity travel.

#### 7. Language:

 Vietnamese is main language; basic English spoken in tourist zones.

#### 8. When to Visit:

Best: March-May, Sept-Nov. Avoid rainy June-August.

#### 9. Other Tips:

- Power: 220V, plug type A/C/D.
- SIM cards with data at airport (Viettel, Vinaphone).
- Be respectful in temples, dress modestly.
